EDITORIAL POLICY

- 1. *Theologia* is a scholarly journal, published by the Communication and Education Services of the Holy Synod of the Church of Greece. Four issues are published per year, two of which are thematic issues and the other two include articles on a variety of scholarly topics.
- 2. The Editorial Committee decides about the themes of thematic issues. The publication of incoming manuscripts follows a "blind refereeing" process, irrespective of the academic status of the authors.
- 3. *Theologia* publishes original scholarly contributions, articles, essays, and book reviews related to various fields of Theology that have not been previously appeared in whole or in part. Published articles do not purport to reflect the opinions or views of the journal.
- 4. Manuscripts submitted to the journal should not exceed 8.500 words. Authors are requested to submit an electronic file via e-mail. Academic/language-focused copyediting is the responsibility of the authors prior to submission.
- 5. *Theologia* publishes articles written, in addition to Greek, in English, French, German, and other languages.
- 6. The final drafts of the manuscripts accepted for publication should be formatted according to the stylesheet of the journal and should not contain any kind of criticisms ad hominem or defamatory material.
- 7. No portion of the published material of *Theologia* –in whole or in part– may be reproduced. Quotations that involve passages are, for academic purposes, permitted with the proviso that due credit is given to the journal.
- 8. Copies of *Theologia* can be exchanged with copies of other scholarly and theological journals but are not offered free of charge.
- 9. Authors will receive a complimentary copy of the journal and, upon their request, an electronic copy of the proofs. Authors are advised to contact the publishing house, should they wish to request the printing of offprints.
- 10. Students and instructors of Theology are entitled to a 50% discount on the annual subscription fees.
